In June 2021, Ministry of Education (MOE) vaccination centres were set up at all three ITE Colleges for medically eligible students to receive their COVID-19 vaccination.


These vaccination centres would allow ITE and other school students to take their vaccination on campus.

Spurred by their passion for design, a team of three ITE students learned to design a Hari Raya cookbook from scratch.



The first-year visual communication students had no prior experience with the software, which is taught in the second year of their course. For showing strong innovation in their business ideas, three teams of ITE students emerged winners of #startable 2021.

They had developed ideas of portable soap flakes, artificial intelligence (AI) artwork that enables the transfer of an artistic image style to any content image, and a card game based on Singapore's culture and landmarks.

Held annually by Nanyang Technological University and ITE, #startable is an entrepreneurship programme for ITE students which is supported by the Chua Thian Poh Entrepreneurship Education Fund. It comprises a bootcamp that trains students in entrepreneurial skills and knowledge.

The top six teams of #startable 2021 presented their ideas at the Finals on 27 May 2021, of which three were selected as the winners.

## Skilling the Built Environment Sector

High-tech built environment labs will be set up at each of ITE's three Colleges, as part of ITE's partnership with urban and infrastructure consulting firm Surbana Jurong.

Called the ITE-Surbana Jurong Living Labs (L<sup>3</sup>), they will be equipped with the latest technologies to facilitate real-world learning for students. Examples include Internet of Things (IoT) devices for monitoring lift performances and smart security surveillance sensors.

Signed on 10 May 2021, the partnership between ITE and Surbana Jurong aims to nurture skilled manpower to support the transformation of the built environment industry.
