An Invitation to the Media on 7 August 2009

Ready to Shine for Singapore Nineteen Medal Hopefuls Gear Up for WorldSkills Competition in Canada

Nineteen young Singaporeans are in the final lap of their intense preparations for the ultimate challenge in technical skills – the 40th WorldSkills Competition (WSC), which will take place in Calgary, Canada, from 1 to 7 September 2009.

Battle of the Best

2 The biennial Competition, widely-billed as the “Olympics of Skills”, will see more than 900 competitors from 51 countries pitting their talents against one another in 45 skills areas. Team Singapore, which comprises 19 competitors from ITE, Singapore Polytechnic, Ngee Ann Polytechnic, Temasek Polytechnic and Nanyang Polytechnic, will compete in 16 skills areas at the WSC (see **Annex A** for the list of competitors and skills areas). Singapore’s representatives hail from the crop of top Medal winners from the 2008 WorldSkills Singapore competition.

3 For Team Singapore to battle it out on the world stage, ITE, leader of the Singapore contingent, has arranged for the competitors to undergo a five-day Lee Foundation Peak Performance Training Camp. It will culminate on 7 August 2009 with an **Interaction Session**, where Mr Bob Tan, Chairman/ITE, will meet with members of Team Singapore.

4 The Camp aims at empowering the competitors with strategies to stay focused and achieve optimum results at the WSC. In the past seven WSCs that it has participated in, Singapore has always garnered commendable results. At the last WSC in Shizuoka, Japan, in 2007, Singapore was ranked 5th among 47 countries in terms of Medal Tally – its highest ranking to date – with a total of two Golds, one Bronze and six Medallions of Excellence. At the 2005 WSC in Helsinki, Finland, Singapore’s competitor in IT – PC & Network Support,

Viridis Liew, was conferred the Albert Vidal Prize, a special award given to the Overall Top Scorer in the whole competition. Another Singaporean, Lo Min Ming, who competed in IT – Software Applications, came in as Second Top Scorer in the same competition.

Team Singapore @ 40th WSC – Competitors and Skills Areas

Institute of Technical Education

Skills Area: Beauty Therapy

21-year-old Chua Ka Wen is certainly one young lady who is in continual pursuit of excellence by taking on new challenges with a smile. Being a multi-tasker, she attended at least 40-hour weekly intensive training in Beauty Therapy for the WorldSkills Singapore (WSS) Competition in 2008, whilst learning professional dancing and taking driving lessons at the same time. Time has never been sufficient for Ka Wen. “It has not been easy for me to cope with all these different training at the same time, but I somehow manage to pull through with my determination and drive”, she remarked.

Ka Wen’s outstanding showing at the WSS paved the way for her participation in the 7th ASEAN Skills Competition, held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, in November 2008. She was part of the pioneer Singapore contingent at the competition, and did not disappoint with a Gold Medal in the Beauty Therapy skills area.

It was then that I realised the full impact of the competition on me and the whole group of competitors on stage."

On participating in the WSC, Joan said: "I will get to experience things which I had never thought to be able to do before. The opportunity to meet people from different countries and trades and sharing experiences with them will definitely widen my perspectives. It will also help me to understand more about the trade and improve my standard of design."

Shawn Chew Chek Phang

Skills Area: Industrial Control

The seed of passion was sown two years before Shawn entered polytechnic life, when he first learned of the WSC while in secondary school. A student with a practical bend, he is adept at hands-on problem-solving skills. Being no stranger to technology competitions, the student leader did his secondary school proud by bringing home many medals.

Three months into his Diploma in Electrical Engineering course at Ngee Ann Polytechnic, Shawn was selected to be trained for WSS 2008. Said Thiam Shui of his WSS training and experience: “I learnt a lot of stuff that was outside the school curriculum, such as setting up an enterprise network comprising Debian Linux servers, Windows servers and Cisco network equipment.”

This newfound knowledge would certainly stand Thiam Shui in good stead when he pits his skills against competitors from around the world in the 40th WSC in September 2009.

The earnest lad hopes to pursue a computer science degree, and then get a job as a software programmer, system administrator or a teacher in future.

Lim Yuan Jie

Skills Area: IT/Software Applications
