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SIX HUNDRED HONG KONG AND SINGAPORE YOUTHS GATHER AT BIENNIAL SEMINAR TO SHARE CREATIVE IDEAS ON TACKLING SOCIAL ISSUES

Hong Kong Chief Secretary for Administration, Carrie Lam; Singapore Consul-General, Jacky Foo; Halogen Foundation Co-Founder, Martin Tan; among distinguished guests joining students at Social Innovation-themed Seminar

Some 600 students from the Hong Kong Vocational Training Council (VTC) and Institute of Technical Education (ITE) will gather at the 5th biennial VTC-ITE International Student Seminar 2015 (ISS 2015) to discuss and exchange ideas on innovative ways to alleviate pressing social issues.

2 Jointly organised by ITE, Singapore and VTC, Hong Kong, the Seminar will be held over three days, from **15 to 17 June 2015**, at the **Hong Kong Design Institute** in **Tseung Kwan O**, **Hong Kong**.

3 Students from both institutions will deliberate on the theme, '**Social Innovation**', and share how they have developed and executed creative solutions to various identified social issues (Please refer to <u>Annex A</u> for details). Besides ITE and VTC participants, students from VTC's partner institutions – Shenzhen Polytechnic, China; and the National Institute of Technology, Kumamoto College, Japan – will also participate in the Seminar.

4 Officiating at the Seminar's **Opening Ceremony** on **15 June 2015** are **Guest-of-Honour, Mrs Carrie Lam**, GBS, JP, Chief Secretary for Administration, Hong Kong SAR, and **Special Guest, Mr Jacky Foo**, Singapore's Consul-General in Hong Kong SAR.

Youths as Agents of Change

5 Inaugurated as a local seminar in 1997, the Seminar went global in 2007 with ITE's collaboration with VTC, one of ITE's most active international partners. This collaboration between ITE and VTC has proven a successful platform for learning and exchange among the youths of both organisations. The Seminar encourages students to see issues from multiple perspectives, and to be advocates and agents of change in the theme under discussion. Not only had past seminars provided opportunities for students to meet and discuss issues and exchange ideas, they had also fostered friendship and understanding among them.

6 To give student participants a deeper insight and broader perspective on Social Innovation, the organisers have invited two guest speakers from Hong Kong and one from Singapore to share their views on three sub-themes. The speakers are: **Mrs Stella Lau Kun Lai-kuen**, JP, Chairperson, Women's Commission of the Hong Kong SAR; **Mr Eric Yim Chiming**, Founder and Chief Designer, POSH Office Systems (HK) Limited; and **Mr Martin Tan**, Executive Director, Institute for Societal Leadership, Singapore Management University, and Co-Founder, Halogen Foundation Singapore.

7 Mr Bruce Poh, Director & CEO, ITE said, "The International Student Seminar is a useful platform for students to discuss and exchange ideas on current issues that impact our community. They can explore transnational and trans-disciplinary approaches in creating, developing and integrating concepts and practices for social challenges in both countries. Such international engagement of youths in both countries is invaluable in enriching their perspectives and educational journey."

	Sayang-sayang Marah-marah	The project focuses on strengthening the bond between parents and child by promoting the awareness of skills in communication. Through a card game designed by the team, both parents and youths can better understand the repercussions/results of their words and behaviour, and how they can resolve misunderstandings.
Community	Fight Depression	The project raises awareness about the alarming increase of suicides and its repercussions. A variety of platforms are engaged to help raise awareness of emotional/mental wellbeing, as well as stories of how one could overcome depression through the use of Wattpad, Pinterest, Padlet, video #iteccfightdepressioncampaign.
	#GlamGramps	The project acknowledges the elderly for their importance in society and the world. A campaign to encourage youths and senior citizens to "exchange" skills and swap clothes was launched.
