A total of 450 ITE School of Engineering students from low-income families will be able to receive monthly financial support, through a \$1.35 million donation from SP Group to ITE.

The funds will be disbursed to them under the newly established SP Group Engineering Study Awards.

Launched on 12 April 2022, the Awards will benefit three separate cohorts of 150 students over the next three years. These students will be receiving a total of \$3,000 each, to help with their daily expenses.

Cultivating Cyber Security Talents

A new Cyber Security Lab to boost cyber security training for ITE students was launched at ITE College East on 30 March 2022. Modelled after a Next-Generation Security Operations Centre, it aims to expose students to the operational conditions and workflows experienced by cyber security professionals.

The Lab was set up in partnership with four technology companies – Lumen Technologies, ReaQta, SecureAge, and TOFFS Technologies. Besides providing the technology infrastructure for the Lab, these companies will also be offering training and internship opportunities for students.

Senior Minister of State for Communications and Information & Health, Dr Janil Puthucheary, officiated the launch of the facility.

Expanding Competencies in Applications Development

ITE students will learn to build mobile and web applications using a low-code platform, through a new partnership between ITE and low-code platform provider OutSystems.

Low-code is a software development approach which requires little coding, and has become increasingly adopted by businesses as a quicker alternative to traditional software development.

The partnership involves the establishment of a Solutioning Centre at ITE College East, which is equipped with the OutSystems platform. At the facility, students will get to develop applications that address real-world issues and needs.

Minister of State for Communications and Information & National Development, Mr Tan Kiat How, launched the facility on 25 March 2022.

Growing Skills, Boosting Employability

ITE has partnered Swiss sewing machine brand Bernina to set up a service training centre for Bernina's machines at ITE College East.

Called the ITE-Bernina Service Training Centre, it trains ITE students to troubleshoot and service Bernina's digital sewing machines. The facility is complemented by a makerspace zone, where students could learn digital sewing using Bernina's machines.

Minister of State for Education and Manpower, Ms Gan Siow Huang, launched the facility on 1 April 2022.

Besides nurturing interest in digital sewing, the partnership serves to build skilled talents that support BERNINA's expansion in the region and boost employment opportunities for ITE students.
