

I pursued Architecture, because I like design. It allows me to express my ideas. I enjoy seeing the ideas in my head come to life in reality. There is always something new to learn in this area.


How has ITE helped you to succeed?



Since he saw the dedication of paramedics transporting his unconscious grandfather to the hospital, Anand has been passionate about saving lives. While he found the Paramedic course at ITE difficult at times, he did not give up. Today, Anand runs his own ambulance company.

What qualities do you need to run an ambulance company? With the COVID-19 pandemic, how has this changed your work?

Managing an ambulance company requires passion and a sincerity to serve the sick. I was providing medical support for many events but the COVID-19 pandemic affected my business badly. This taught me to adapt and change my business model. Nowadays, I train and supply temperature takers and swabbers.

How was your experience at ITE?

My experience at ITE was enjoyable, although the Paramedic course was not easy. I spent countless nights burning the midnight oil, familiarising myself with signs and symptoms of diseases. Luckily, I received a lot of encouragement from my lecturers. They were very patient with me and went the extra mile so students could understand the content being covered.

What is your greatest takeaway from ITE?

The greatest takeaway I had from ITE was learning to lead. Although I am an introvert, I learnt to step out of my comfort zone and grow my leadership skills through my training as a paramedic. My internship with the Singapore Civil Defence Force (SCDF) was also interesting, and I managed to pick up hands-on skills.



What's a Boeing 737 plane doing on ITE grounds? Well, if you haven't heard, it is one of the authentic learning "classrooms" at ITE College Central's Aerospace Hub!





Designed to provide hands-on training in aircraft maintenance, the Aerospace Hub features a hangar that is equipped with real aircraft structures. These include military aircraft such as the Bell UH-1H helicopter and A4 Skyhawk, as well as private and passenger aircraft such as the Learjet 24B and Boeing 737 (ITE is the only education institution in Singapore with an actual commercial passenger aircraft on campus!). The hangar also houses aircraft engines that support training in aircraft engine inspection and repair.

Training is enhanced by specialised software such as the "Airbus Competence Training (ACT) for Academy", which allows you to explore an Airbus aircraft and perform maintenance tasks through 3D simulations!





Sounds great! But why is it there?

Simply to give students an idea of what to expect in the aerospace industry, while allowing them to train in a safe and controlled environment! Sure beats sitting through a full day of lectures and tutorials, don't you think?

*N(A) Level students who qualify for the Direct Entry Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP) and 'O' Level students will join the new three-year programme directly in the second year, and will continue to attain the Higher Nitec qualification in two years.

DO YOU KNOW?

Starting with selected courses in 2022, ITE's *Nitec* and *Higher Nitec* curriculum will be merged into a three-year programme that leads directly to a *Higher Nitec* qualification. All ITE courses will follow this curriculum structure by 2026. Currently, 'N' Level holders typically take four years to attain a *Higher Nitec* qualification, through a two-year *Nitec* course followed by a two-year *Higher Nitec* course.
