
Lee Kuan Yew Gold Medal

The Lee Kuan Yew Awards for ITE students were instituted in 1999 through the sale proceeds of the special edition of the memoirs of Singapore's first Prime Minister, Mr Lee Kuan Yew, entitled, "The Singapore Story". A sum of \$555,000 was donated to ITE for the establishment of the awards.

The Lee Kuan Yew Gold Medals for ITE students are aimed at promoting technical education by giving greater recognition to the achievements of ITE students and trainees.

Lee Kuan Yew Gold Medals are awarded to the top graduates from ITE College Central, ITE College East and ITE College West who have excelled in their course of study and co-curricular activities, and made contributions to an enriching College life.



Transformed to Serve

Raised by a single mother who had to take on multiple jobs to bring up the family, Aloysius Moh was initially indifferent to his family's difficult circumstances and often got into trouble. In ITE, he actively volunteered to organise events for community groups, such as the AWWA Annual Gathering, an event that celebrates the achievements of families who had overcome hardships. Rallying over 200 volunteers from ITE College East, Shazuan spearheaded the project and emceed at the event.

He has proven to be a true agent of change and won respect from his peers as a caring and dynamic leader.

Richard's insatiable thirst for knowledge and practical skills has successfully helped in his career switch and given him the confidence to take on new work challenges.


Hit the Ground Running
